## Graduate's Posture Research Receives National Attention

• Outstanding work in the field of physical education has been accredited to Lulu E. Sweigard, a Teachers College graduate, in an article entitled "Sweigard System Corrects Posture by Rest" found in the January 6 issue of "Life" magazine.

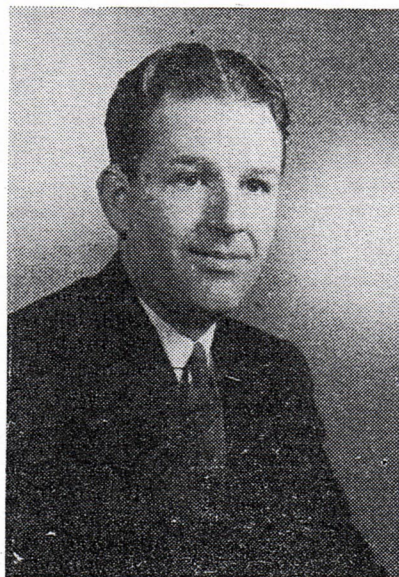
Graduating from Teachers College in 1918, Dr. Sweigard later returned as an instructor in physical education, and remained for several years. She is not the originator of the theory of "constructive rest" but worked with Miss Mabel Elsworth Todd who did originate it, said Dr. Monica R. Wild, head of the department of physical education for women. Work at Columbia Teachers college preceded her going to New York university.

Very little has been written about Dr. Sweigard's work. In fact, according to Dr. Wild, she has written only two articles concerning her work. Miss Wild also states that previously Dr. Sweigard has received in adequate recognition for her work, although she has been working more than ten years on posture improvement. She is, no doubt, the chief authority on the subject at the present time.
